Traffic restrictions at Arizona Avenue

Lane restrictions will be in place for two weeks at the intersection of Arizona Avenue and Germann Road beginning Monday, Aug. 8.

The restrictions will accommodate the installation of sewer, water and reclaimed water lines to serve a new mini-storage development being built on the southeast corner of the intersection.

The project is scheduled to be completed by Monday, Aug. 22, and construction will occur during evening and overnight hours. There will be traffic restrictions on Arizona Avenue and Germann

Road for the duration of the project, with left turns at the intersection prohibited at various times after 7 p.m.

Access to businesses will be maintained at all times and traffic restrictions will be eased during daytime hours, but barricades will be in place to guide traffic around work zones.
